Course Aim

ASIST helps to build networks of trained caregivers who can support each and use common terminology to approach suicide and safety. By training caregivers at the University of Sheffield, it is hoped that ASIST will help reduce suicidal feelings in those students and staff at risk, and help staff to recognise warning signs and intervene in the interests of promoting a suicide safe community.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is a two-day interactive workshop in suicide first aid. ASIST teaches participants to recognise when someone may have thoughts of suicide and work with them to create a plan that will support their immediate safety.

Content

The workshop includes a mix of the following methods of training:

- Presentations and guidance from two LivingWorks registered trainers
- A scientifically proven intervention model
- Powerful audio visual learning aids
- Group discussions
- Skills practice and development
- A balance of challenge and safety

Everyone who attends the course will receive a copy of the ASIST workbook, which is an excellent support resource. When you have completed the course, you will also receive a certificate to confirm that have undergone ASIST training.
